


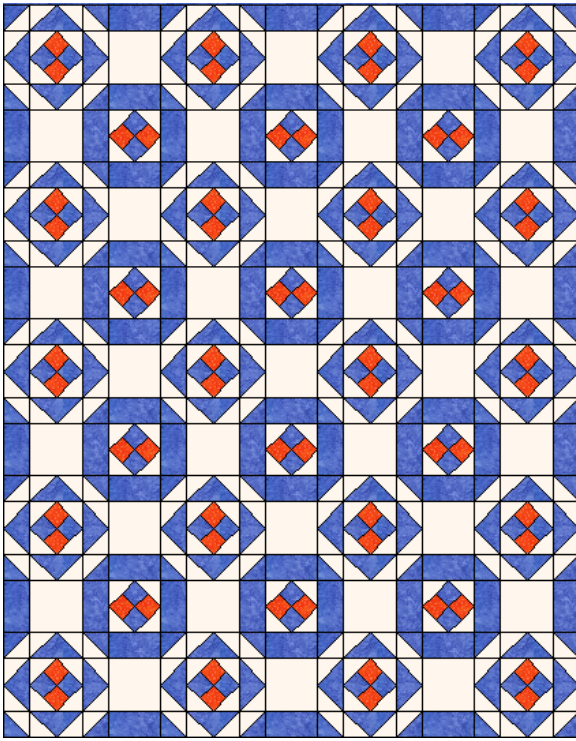


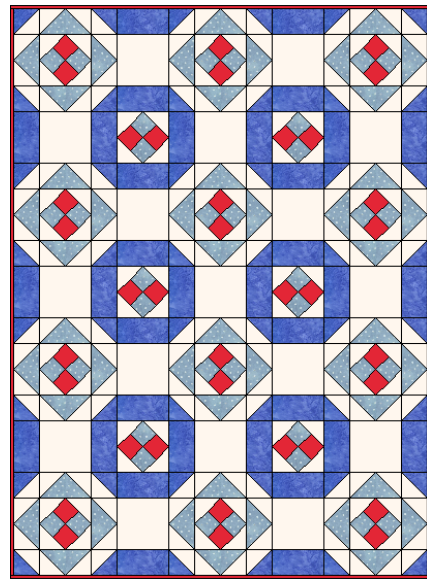
| Step 6 (Assemble the units into the Main Blocks)  |   |   |

| <p>All versions</p>   | <p>Working with 12 (20) of the four-patch in a square units, sew the long edge of flying geese units to the top and the bottom. Press the seams toward the four-patch. Sew a half square triangle patch each end of the remaining flying geese units. The background should be together. Press the seam toward the half square triangles. Sew the three pieces together. Press seams away from the four-patch. (Scrappy version not shown.)</p> |  <p>Three color</p> <p>Four Color</p> |
| <p>Hurrah! All the components to your quilt are done!<br/>The rectangles from Step 2 are sashing blocks, the 6 (12) remaining four-patch-in-a-squares are cornerstones.</p> |   |   |
| <p>Row 1 and all odd rows</p>   | <p>Alternate 3 (4) main blocks and 2 (3) sashing blocks, with the zinger color up and down.</p>   |                                     |
| <p>Row 2 and all even rows</p>  | <p>Alternate 3 (4) sashing blocks and 2 (3) cornerstones with the zinger color left and right.</p>  |                                     |
